HNB History

2017

Started as a mission of National Community Church with a dozen volunteers Initially started supplying additional items to the resettlement agencies basic set ups

2018

Started assisting all the resettlement agencies and providing everything - and more for the home set ups

2019

Spun off from NCC to officially form HNB

2020

- Hired first staff (two part-time employees
- Expanding our programs Established formal board of directors

2021

- Moved into own warehouse space/office Fall of Kabul and SURGE of refugees and donations!!!! Hired 2 fulltime and 3 parttime employees.





NEED



Home Set Ups

- Refugees and SIVs are required by State Dept. mandate to have certain items in their home upon resettlement
- \$4,800 (\$1,200 per individual is the stipend) for a refugee family of 4.
- \$3,200 is the average cost of furnishings for a full home set up for a family of 4, which they would have to pay if it was not donated.

Moving Up Fund

 New refugees have to take low wage jobs right away and then cannot afford to take time off for more training to improve their employment a corporate resume but no connections or direction in their industry.

Artisan Empowerment

 We need home goods (and cultural appropriate decorative touches for our set ups) and want to support refugees and their handy work and have others do as well.

 Helping refugee artisans sell their items and also buying them for home set ups

2022 - So Far...

 Complete 450 full set ups or partial furnishing drop offs Distributed nearly \$1 million in home goods and furniture (80 percent that is donated) Helped 100 individuals find employment Provided cash assistance to 24 individuals seeking job training Supported 8 artisans and used their items in home set ups
