Homelessness

How do you become homeless?

- Major causes:
 - Lack of affordable housing
 - Job loss
 - Poverty
 - Mental illness and/or Substance abuse
 - Domestic violence (especially women)



Who are the homeless?

- 80% of homelessness is temporary
- About 30% have mental illness and/or a drug/alcohol addiction problem
- About 70% of homeless are single and 30% are families
- Chronic homelessness takes about 30 years off life expectancy





Homeless

Washington DC area

- About 4,100 were counted as homeless in the District as of January 2022
- Once one is homeless it can be very difficult to re-establish work and a home
- Shoebox Project over the winter holidays provides warm winter hat, winter gloves, winter socks and more
- Resource Card to help people find access to food, shelter, showers, health care, clothing, Internet access and city services





Shoebox Project

World Bank staff & FMW - 31st year!

- Provided 1,325 "Shoebox gifts" last year
- Each gift is a set of necessities for a homeless man, woman or child
- Packed at the Friends Meeting of Washington near Dupont Circle
- Delivered to homeless shelters and encampments around the winter holidays
